Community displays

Cancer Council Queensland is a not-for-profit, non-government organisation that provides information and support free of charge for people with cancer, their families and friends.

Community Education Program

The Community Education Program aims to reduce the incidence, prevalence, morbidity and mortality of cancer by promoting knowledge, skills and behaviours for the prevention and early detection of cancer. The program delivers free presentations, displays and resources on the prevention and early detection of cancer to workplaces, community groups and sporting organisations.



Community Speakers Program

Cancer Council Queensland Community Speakers Program is an education program which delivers free presentations to organisations, workplaces and community groups. Five topic areas aim to raise awareness of cancer risk factors and the importance of early detection. See the inside cover of this brochure for more information on the topics available.

Presentations run for 30 minutes and relevant resources are distributed to attendees. Cancer Council Queensland community speakers are volunteers who are specially trained to deliver these messages to adults in the community.



For whom

Invite a community speaker to visit your workplace, sporting club, service club, parent group, in fact, any group or organisation who wishes to hear from us.

This is an adult education program and is not suitable for student groups. Schools should call our offices to find out about other programs and resources catering to their needs.



Mode of presentation

Community speakers are available as a free community service and will tailor the presentation to the needs of your group. The presentations are interesting and informative as well as practical in reinforcing and encouraging the importance of taking care of your health. All topics are approximately 30 minute presentations. When booking your topic please allow three to four weeks lead time.
